



## **Covenant Living at Windsor Park REOPENING UPDATE**

### **Residential Living:**

- Visitation Requirements: Guests are welcome in all common spaces. Beginning, Monday, April 12, 2021 the screening of RL guests and residents will cease at the guard station entrance. The entrance on St. Charles Road will be reopened.
- A fully vaccinated resident off campus overnight no longer needs to socially isolate when returning to campus
- A fully vaccinated resident overnight in the hospital no longer needs to quarantine when returning to campus
- Guests are now welcome in all common spaces. This includes the London Grill, the dining room (lunch only), fitness gym, library etc. Please follow all posted infection prevention protocols.
- Guest Rooms are open, or guests may stay in resident apartments or the Estates

### **Amenity Areas:**

- Dining – Limited dining is offered in the dining room and The London Grille. Guests are welcome at all venues except the evening meal in the dining room. This is to ensure all residents who choose to can be accommodated.
- Fitness – Small group classes of 10 are occurring and full use of equipment is allowed
- Activities – Group activities are being held in the Centrum and the Auditorium with limited capacity.
- Live Chapel Services are also being held with limited capacity for social distancing.

### **Assisted Living:**

All staff and visitors to Assisted Living and Johnson Health and Rehab will be screened upon entering the building and must perform hand-hygiene

1. Outdoor visitation is now encouraged and is preferred versus indoor. Weather permitting, families can visit with residents on our campus or in the Johnson courtyard.
2. Indoor visitation can continue to occur, and visitors must be pre-screened 24 hours in advance. This means we will be continuing to schedule the visits. Only scheduled visits will be allowed.  
Currently we are scheduling these visits daily.

3. In room visitation can continue.  
**We are now allowing up to two visitors per scheduled visit in resident apartments.**
4. In house visitation can only occur for non-vaccinated residents if the county positivity rate is below 10% and if 70% of residents have been vaccinated. If both conditions have not been met, then only vaccinated residents can participate with inhouse visitation. Otherwise nonvaccinated residents can have visits outdoors.
5. **Fully vaccinated residents can have physical touch with their visitors, but both still need to be wearing a tight fitted mask. Before and after they must remain 6 feet apart.**
6. **No more than two visitors at a time for each resident and we will continue keeping the visits to approximately 30 minutes.**
7. If the facility has a positive COVID then all visits are suspended while we are testing all residents and staff. Once completed visits can resume if the facility has the ability to cohort the effected residents. Visits cannot occur on the unit where COVID positive residents are moved to.
8. **Visitors must wear a mask at all times. If they take it off or refuse to wear one, they cannot enter the building regardless of their vaccination status.**
9. **Fully vaccinated residents are no longer subject to 14-day quarantine following outings with family members.**
10. **Unvaccinated residents** that leave campus with families will be individually assessed, based on circumstances of time away, to determine whether or not they would need to be quarantined for 14 days following the visit.  
Unvaccinated residents that spend overnight off campus will be quarantined for 14 days.

*Amenity Areas:*

- Dining – Socially distanced dining is occurring in the dining room.
- Activities – In person socially distanced small group activities.
- Chapel Services – In person with community Chaplains

**Skilled Nursing Care:**

1. Outdoor visitation is now encouraged and is preferred versus indoor.  
Weather permitting, families can visit with residents on our campus or in the Johnson courtyard.
2. Indoor visitation can continue to occur, and visitors must be pre-screened 24 hours in advance. This means we will be continuing to schedule the visits. Only scheduled visits will be allowed. Currently we are scheduling these visits on Wednesdays and Thursdays and will look at other days as we can. If families cannot make it on those days, we will work with them one on one to accommodate.
3. In room visitation can occur but only under certain conditions. If it is a private room and/or in the case of a semiprivate if the roommate is not in the room. If the roommate

and the other resident cannot leave the room due to medical reason the in-room visits can occur, but the curtain must be drawn, and the family of the other resident must be notified prior to the visit. Otherwise inhouse visitation for semiprivate rooms will be done in the garden room.

4. In house visitation can only occur for non-vaccinated residents if the county positivity rate is below 10% and if 70% of your residents have been vaccinated. If both conditions have not been meeting, then only vaccinated residents can participate with inhouse visitation. Otherwise nonvaccinated residents can have visits outdoors.
5. **Fully vaccinated residents** can have physical touch with their visitors, but both still need to be wearing a tight fitted mask. Before and after they must remain 6 feet apart.
6. **Residents under quarantine cannot have visits until they have completed their 14 days of quarantine.** We can schedule compassionate visits if needed but visitors must wear full PPE.
7. **No more than two visitors at a time for each resident and we will continue keeping the visits to approximately 30 minutes.**
8. If the facility has a positive COVID then all visits are suspended while we are testing all residents and staff. Once completed visits can resume as long as the facility has the ability to cohort the effected residents. Visits cannot occur on the unit where COVID positive residents are moved to.
9. **Visitors must wear a mask at all times. If they take it off or refuse to wear one, they cannot enter the building regardless of their vaccination status.**
